Program Successes

MENTORING

- Lunch Buddy Program. This initiative, in collaboration with Richland County School District One, links adult African-American men with elementary to high school students who may not have a male role model in their lives. Meetings are held and each session is 1½ hours. At each meeting, a relevant topic is discussed that will hopefully help the mentees in their daily lives. Such topics include interviewing techniques, resume preparation, obtaining and keeping good credit, entrepreneurism and career choices, investments in the stock market and other securities, and a series of motivational talks. This program runs concurrent with the school year. Six schools and over 150 students participate in this program annually. The number of student participants who enrolled in an institution of higher learning increased by 20% because of participating in the program.
- **DJJ Lunch Connection.** This initiative began in 2004, and mirrors the Lunch Buddy Program. Sessions are conducted once a month at the Stevenson Correctional Facility of SC Department of Juvenile Justice with approximately 40 participants. Since its inception, it has been reported that there has been a 40% decrease in disciplinary action taken against the inmate (lock ups, write ups).

EDUCATION

• Scholarship Awards. The 100 provides annual scholarship awards to deserving matriculating students who will be full-time students at accredited, post-secondary institutions based on 100 Black Men of Greater Columbia, Inc. eligibility criteria. Scholarship dollars assist youth in completing educational goals by providing resources to offset expenses associated with tuition, books and housing. Each year five (5) graduating high school seniors will receive an award in the amount of \$2,000 that will be disbursed over a four-year period, if the student maintains a minimum 2.5 GPA.

HEALTH & WELLNESS

- Blood Drives and Health Fairs/Screenings Healthcare initiatives are provided to citizens through several programs in collaboration with the following:
 - Harambee Festival This collaboration with Benedict College has provided over 100 prostate, diabetes, and blood pressure screenings during the annual Harambee Festival celebration which is held on the last Saturday in February of each year.
 - Black Expo (Columbia) Over 50 diabetes and blood pressure screenings are performed during this annual event which is held on the third Saturday in May of each year.
 - Palmetto Health Education Sessions are held throughout the year, and are designed to educate African-American males on prostate cancer and obesity.

ECONOMIC EMPOWERMENT

• The 100 considers economic empowerment a necessary step toward creating a just society and 100 defines economic empowerment as the ability to be self-determined in creating dreams, pursuing them, and ultimately perpetuating them by establishing the mechanisms to sustain generational wealth. Our program initiatives are designed to promote generational economic self-sufficiency through financial literacy, family wealth building, and entrepreneurship.

LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT

Saturday Leadership Academy is a lifelong mentoring and character development Intervention program, followed by a lifelong
Citizenship mentoring program designed to motivate young men of middle and high school age to achieve a higher level of success
in school and as citizens. An average of 50 participants from throughout the Greater Columbia Area has graduated from this
program annually.
